

Types of Pronouns + Examples

Personal Pronoun

Substitutes a person's name

Example: It wants more food.

Indefinite Pronoun

Replaces a nonspecific noun

Example: Everything looks just right.

Relative Pronoun

Connects a clause or phrase to a noun or pronoun

Example: The dog that lives next door barks all night long.

Intensive Pronoun

Emphasizes or intensifies nouns and pronouns

Example: I myself like to travel.

Possessive Pronoun

Shows that a noun owns or posses something

Example: The decision is theirs.

Interrogative Pronoun

Asks a question

Example: Who is absent?

Reflexive Pronoun

Replaces the object of a sentence when it refers to the same person or item in the subject

Example: Nadine taught herself Spanish.

Demonstrative Pronoun

Indicates a specific noun

Example: This is my favorite song.

Reciprocal Pronoun

Shows an action that two or more nouns are performing together

Example: My parents love each other.
