Here are examples of sentences written in both the active voice and the passive voice, with the active voice sentence appearing first:

Tells what a person or thing does.

The object is who or what receives the action and typically comes after the action (verb).

PASSIVE VOICE

Tells what is done to someone or something.

The subject performs the action action (verb).

The object is who or what receives the action and typically comes before the action (verb).

> Larry generously donated money to the homeless shelter.

The wedding planner is making all the reservations.

PASSIVE All the reservations are being made by the wedding planner.

> Thousands of tourists view the Grand Canyon every year.

The Grand Canyon is viewed by thousands of tourists every year.

> The saltwater eventually corroded the metal beams.

PASSIVE The metal beams were eventually corroded by the saltwater.

She faxed her application for a new job.

The application for a new job was faxed by her.
