# Types of Conjunctions

## Coordinating Conjunctions

Joins words, phrases and independent clauses

#### **Examples:**

The park is empty now, but it will be filled with children after school.

He was very intelligent, yet his grades were poor.

#### Conjunctions:

# Subordinating Conjunctions

Introduces a dependent clause and ties it to an independent clause

#### **Examples:**

If you leave, I will be lonely.

Whenever we run out of cookies, I am sad.

# Correlative Conjunctions

A pair of conjunctions that must be used together

### **Examples:**

I either want ice cream or yogurt.

He would rather drive around lost than ask for directions.

- such / that scarcely / when
- as many / as
- no sooner / than
