

HOW TO CREATE Word Lists and Flash Cards ON YOURDICTIONARY

It's easy to store a list of spelling words or study words on YourDictionary. And, you can make studying even easier with your list's built-in flash cards.

1. Add First Word

Search for a word on YourDictionary and click on the orange "+Add to Word List" button.

2. Log In

Log in with your Facebook or Google+ account. (If you are already signed in to either of these you will automatically be logged in to word lists.)

3. Create Username

Enter the username you want shown as the author for all of your word lists.

4. Add Title and Description

Give your new word list a clear title and helpful description.

POWER TIP: Once you have created your word list go to your word list page and click the link to "add words" or "edit list." From there you can quickly enter multiple words separated by a comma. We will catch any misspellings for you.

5. Add More Words

Search for more words on YourDictionary to add to your new list.

6. Save It!

Save as "public" (available to everyone) or "private" (for your eyes only).

7. Study Flash Cards

From your word list page click the orange "Study Flash Cards" button. Flash cards will automatically be created for your word list.

- Create public word lists for each week's vocabulary words so your students can study the flash cards.
- Prepare word lists as part of lesson plans including key vocabulary words for a specific lesson or book chapter.
- Encourage student teams to read an assignment and develop a public word list for the rest of the class to study.

Tips for Students:

- Create, share, and study word lists for your weekly spelling words.
- Create multiple word lists for vocabulary words (such as colors, days of the week, food items, or even for words that are new to you).
- Study word lists to prepare for school entrance exams (such as the SAT and GRE).
