

Guided Open Question & Answer Time

Having an open discussion with your students where they can ask whatever questions they want is an excellent idea. However, you might be faced with some questions that are difficult to answer in a classroom setting, or you may even be asked something that you don't have an answer for at all.

Choosing a guided open question and answer time can help alleviate those concerns.

Here are some questions to consider for your guided discussion:

1. Does anyone have questions about the grammar lesson we conducted yesterday?
2. Is anyone unclear on the meaning of one or more of these vocabulary words?
3. Does anyone have questions about the content of the story/movie/poem/novel/etc.?
4. Does anyone have questions about language and culture?
5. Does anyone have questions about culture in the United States?
6. Does anyone have questions about culture associated with the English language?
7. Does anyone have questions about the history of the English language?
8. Does anyone have questions about any holidays celebrated in the United States?
9. Does anyone have questions about (name of upcoming holiday)?
10. Does anyone have questions about the vocabulary associated with the holiday?
